Data collected from the CHNA survey will help DOH-Pasco better understand the needs of the community and will be used to develop a community health improvement plan, addressing the issues residents are most concerned about.

To participate in the survey, you need to be 18 years old or older and live in Pasco County. The survey comprises of 16 main questions, with additional follow-up questions based on your responses.
